ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Govt. Degree College, Nirmand, is a co-educational institution established in the year 2016 to empower the young minds of one of the largest villages in Himachal Pradesh—Nirmand, through a culture of academic rigor, creativity and discipline. Since its inception vide notification No. EDN-A-KA(1)4/2012, dated 16th May 2016, of the Govt. of Himachal Pradesh, the institution has been functioning in the building of Govt. Primary School (Nirmand) and it offers two undergraduate programmes—Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Commerce. With its humble beginning, with strength of 40 students, the college today stands committed to foster a spirit of academic excellence and holistic growth among 182 students of the college. An Overview of the UGC-CBCS (Choice Based Credit System) Undergraduate <u>Programmes</u>:

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising Core, Compulsory, Skill Enhancement and Elective Courses. The courses are evaluated by following a grading system. In order to bring uniformity in the evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed.

Outline of Courses under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS):

1. **Core Course**: A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as Core Course.

- 2. **Elective Course:** Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
 - 2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective course offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of Inter disciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).
 - 2.2 **Dissertation/Project:** An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.
 - 2.3 **Generic Elective (GE) Course:** An elective course which is other than discipline specific core course and is chosen generally from an <u>unrelated discipline/subject</u>, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic elective.

3. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** The Ability Enhancement Courses (AE) may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement: (i) Environmental Science and (ii) English/MIL Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

3.1 **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):** Environmental Science, English Communication/Modern Indian Language (MIL) Communication.

3.2 **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge.

- A student cannot choose two languages as DSC I and DSC II. For example, a student cannot choose English as DSC I and Hindi as DSC II.
- Choosing of subject / course by a candidate does not guarantee admission to a particular course. Admission of a student in a course will be merit based only

For example, if a student has English as DSC I and Economics as DSC II, then he/ she can only choose History/ Hindi/ Political Science/ Music (V) as GE.

Evaluation System of Undergraduate CBCS Programme

As per RUSA/HP University guidelines, the marks scheme for all undergraduate courses in annual system for **BA/BCom** will be in the ratio of **70:30**,i.e.,70marks for theory (Annual/Term End Examination) and 30 marks for **Continuous Comprehensive Assessment(CCA)/Internal Assessment (IA).** In annual system for all courses of **BCom practical subjects** the ratio will be **50:20:30**, i.e.50 marks for theory and 20 marks for **practical** (Annual/Term End) and 30 marks for **CCA/IA.**

As per University norms 30% marks of CCA will be determined by the concerned teacher in the annual system on the basis of following components:

- 1. House Test=10
- 2. Term Test/Class Test=05
- 3. Assignments/Seminars=10
- 4. Class room attendance=5

In the annual system classroom attendance will be defined as follows:

75% 80%	1 mark
80% 85%	2 marks
85% 90%	3 marks
90% 95%	4 marks
95% and above	5 marks

Mid Term/ House Test

• One **Mid Term/House Test** of 10 marks (Annual System) will be conducted in each academic year.

- It is mandatory for every student to appear in the Mid Term/House Test and the marks obtained shall contribute to the total IA/CCA of 30%.
- As per University guidelines the students who do not get 35% marks in IA/CCA will not be allowed to appear in Annual Examination.

Other Information Related to Evaluation

- 1. InternalAssessment/ContinuousComprehensiveAssessment(CCA)andTermEnd Examinations will be as per RUSA provisions for annual system.
- 2. In annual system, the minimum passing marks is 40% in aggregate. However, it is mandatory to score 35% inCCA and also 35% in the Final Examination for passing.
- 3. A candidate failing either in one or two subjects/papers in annual examination will be placed under compartment in those subjects/papers. Such students will have only two chances—one at supplementary stage and another at the annual stage to clear his/her compartment.
- 4. A candidate failing in three or more subjects/papers will be treated as fail in that year and will have to repeat the entire year.
- 5. The result shall be declared as per grading system and the students will have to complete the degree within5years.
- 6. Re-evaluation shall be applicable as per provisions of HP University ordinance for annual system.
- 7. Final examinations shall be held in the month of March/April and supplementary examinations in the month of September/October every year.

Note: The above guidelines/conditions may vary as per latest notification by the University.

Admission to BA/ BCom 1st Year:

(Note: All the admissions made by the college are provisional till regularized by H.P. University.)

Eligibility for Admission

- 1. **Bachelor of Arts (BA Pass Course):** The students who have passed +2 examinations or an examination equivalent to a Board/University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (including English) with 33% marks.
- 2. **Bachelor of Commerce (BCom Pass Course):** The candidates with 40% marks in commerce stream or 45% marks in four written subjects, including English at +2 level, are eligible for admission to BCom pass course. The minimum eligibility condition for a girl student to get admission in BCom is 33% marks in +2 examination. However, for admission to BCom pass course the candidate must have passed Mathematics or Economics as compulsory subject at his/her +2 stage.

Note :i. All the admissions in BA/ BCom 1st Year will be made on the basis of merit of the qualifying examination, that is, on the basis of percentage/marks of +2 examination.

ii. The student placed under compartment or failed in +2 examinations are not eligible

forseeking admission.

Age Limit and Relaxation

- 1. Admission is not granted to the student in 1st Year if he/she has attained the age of 23 in the case of boys and 25 in the case of girls on 1st July of the year concerned.
- 2. The upper age limit will be raised by three years for students belonging to SC/ST categories.
- 3. The Principal has a discretion to provisionally grant age relaxation to the students of general category up to a maximum of six months subject to the final approval by the Vice-Chancellor of H.P. University.

General Instructions Related to the Admission Process for BA/BCom 1st Year:

- 1. The candidates will have to download the college prospectus from the college website<u>https://www.gcnirmand.edu.in/</u>. The candidates are advised to read the various instructions regarding admission in the prospectus before applying for admission online.
- 2. The candidates seeking admission can apply **online(through link available on college** website) from1stJune, 2025 to 19thJune, 2025.They will have to register themselves by making an account with a valid e-mail id on the admission portal available on the college website Please note that there is no provision of filling up forms in an offline mode.
- 3. There will be Pre- Admission counselling for students seeking admission in the college from 13thJune 2025 to 19th June 2025 in the college campus. The students can clear their doubts related to BA and BCom programmes and the admission procedure as well.

- Admission to BA/BCom2ndyear and3rdyear is on Roll on basis for which they have to apply through online mode only from 01st June 2025 to 19th June 2025. The students will have to download the college prospectus from the college website <u>https://www.gcnirmand.edu.in/</u>. They can fill the online admission form by logging into the account created on the admission portal available on the college website in the previous year. Please note that there is no provision of filling up the form in an offline mode.
- 2. In the roll on system, the students who have studied in 1st and 2nd year in the previous session are allowed to take provisional admission in the next class, i.e. in 2nd and 3rd year respectively, without waiting for the final result of the previous year.

The enrolment process includes a physical fitness test on the date which is decided by the ANO with the permission of the Principal. It is mandatory for all the cadets to attend the Annual Training camp every year which makes them eligible for BEE and CEE certificates. The training offered by the unit in still safekeeping of patriotism and discipline in the cadets for upholding the unity and integrity of our country.

NATIONALSERVICESCHEME (NSS):

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is an Indian government-sponsored public service program conducted by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports. It aims to develop student's personality through community service. Half new unit of NSS (50 volunteers) was sanctioned to Govt. Degree College-Nirmand on 03 December, 2022 vide notification No. 1/ 2009 – (Allot)/ NSS/ HPU:-981.

The unit follows the motto "Not Me But You" and actively organize cleanliness drives, plantation drives and awareness programs in the college. The volunteers have to participate in a seven-day special camp every year. The date of enrolment is decided by the NSS Programme Officer with the permission of the Principal. The interested students can apply on the prescribed form available with the NSS Programme Officer.

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Leave Rules:

- 1. A student can proceed on leave with the prior permission from the college Principal. The application should also be prior signed by parent/ guardian of the student and duly recommended by the teacher.
- 2. A teacher can sanction leave up to maximum of 5 days and leave for longer duration will be sanctioned by the college Principal.
- 3. The student should make sure that the leave is noted by all the concerned teachers.
- 4. Leave on account of illness, if more than three days, must be accompanied by the medical certificate.
- 5. Students participating in various inter-college or inter-university or other competitions including NCC camps, will have to get their leave sanctioned by the college Principal on the recommendation of their in-charges before their departure.

Note:

- General leave will only be counted for the relaxation in fine only and not be counted as the lecture attended.
- In case of participation in sports, cultural, NCC, NSS and other activities, the credit will be given to the students and days engaged in these activities will be counted as lectures attended.

Other Rules And Regulations:

- 1. Students will be issued identity cards by the college. It is mandatory for all the students to carry the identity cards to college every day.
- 2. It is mandatory for every student to maintain strict discipline within the college premises. Any act of a student that amounts to indiscipline will be dealt strictly. The following act comes within the ambit of indiscipline and misconduct: -
 - ✓ Ragging in and around the college campus
 - ✓ Eve-teasing
 - ✓ Scribbling/ Writing anything on the white-board, smart boards, furniture, walls, etc.
 - ✓ Damaging college property-- Breaking furniture/ window panes/ Tempering electrical and water fittings
 - \checkmark Removing notices
 - ✓ Holding any meeting/ function/ party in the college premises without any prior permission of the Principal
 - ✓ Using foul language in the campus
 - ✓ Bringing outsiders to the campus

- Smoking/ chewing tobacco, taking drugs/ intoxicants/ alcohol anywhere in the college premises
- ✓ Any other act or acts which the Principal considers as major acts of misconduct and indiscipline
- 3. All the students are directed to read the notices displayed on the college notice board every day and do the needful accordingly.
- 4. Use of mobile phones is prohibited in classrooms and examination hall.
- 5. The name of a student shall be struck off from the college rolls, if there is an absence without sanctioned leave continuously for 10 days or more.
- 6. <u>Regarding Readmission</u>: If the name of a student is struck off, he/ she must be accompanied by his/ her parent or guardian at the time of re-admission. **The student must seek re-admission within six days of the notice regarding the same.**

Note: It is compulsory for all the students (and their parents) to submit an online Anti-Ragging undertaking affidavit every academic year.


